Wong Sai Weng, one of the Board of Directors of Malaysian Missionary Services Trust (MMST) was the first to give his report followed by Dr Chew Chye Poh from Orang Asli Ministry (OAM). The next report was from Eugene Yapp, Principal of Gospel Literature Outreach Training School, Taiping (GLO). Stephen Lew from Malaysian Myanmar Ministry (MMM) then reported on their work among the Myanmarese and the final report was by Loh Ah Asiau from Gospel Outreach Worldwide (GOWW). The seminar ended with the singing of the theme song followed by a closing prayer from KC Ung.

LAA was the next to be interviewed.
